Games of September 25 - 29, 2025

With this issue we debut our 2025 Spreadsheet. This exclusive feature provides concise comparative data for all 136 FBS college and all 32 NFL teams. With the data you'll be able to analyze games of your choice, including games on which we have just an opinion or lean. From the data you may be able to uncover some additional selections that may meet your own criterion or selection preferences. The Spreadsheet should be viewed not as a substitute for the selections in the Newsletter, but rather as a supplement. By looking at how teams match up in various fundamental and technical areas you'll be able to better see the 'hows' and 'whys' of football. Let's look at the data which is the same for both the colleges and the pros.

The first data is very basic, with the straight up (**W-L**) and pointspread (**C-N-P**) records shown followed by the average points scored and allowed plus margin of victory/defeat. Then comes rush, pass and total yardage per game averages, (against all foes, including non I-A college teams). Offensive data is given first, then defensive data. Also shown are net total yards per game gained/allowed and net turnover margin for the season (not per game average). We then show several sets of Power Ratings, which we discuss below.

AVE PWR RTG is a team's Average Power Rating and is based on a team's results, measured totally by final scores. These are 'raw' Ratings that are the basis for more detailed Ratings. These are evaluated on a weekly basis and adjusted based upon comparing expected victory margin vs. actual margin, as predicted by current Power Rating and take into account, in the case of the colleges, a team's Conference Rating.

AVE OPP PWR RTG is the Average Opponents' Power Rating and is based upon the same concepts as a team's own Power Ratings. It is derived simply by taking an average of all opponents' Power Ratings at the time the game was played. This gives us a basic measure of a team's level of competition. For the colleges Opponents' Power Ratings are also influenced by the strength of a team's Conference Rating.

NET CHG is the pure change in a team's Power Rating from the season's start and measure whether a team has improved or worsened during the season.

LINE POWR is the Line Power rating and is an attempt to measure a team's strength based on both how the public perceives the team (in terms of the Average Line Played Against, or their average pointspread) and how the team actually performs on the field (in terms of Average Result Vs. the Line). A higher number is better and we use a weighting formula that places somewhat more of an emphasis on how the team performs as opposed to how the team is expected to perform. We weight "Reality" heavier than "Perception."

GAME PLAY POWR is Game Play Power Rating and is an attempt to evaluate the result of each games in a numerical fashion by looking at other factors in addition to the final score. In particular we look at rushing yardage, passing yardage and turnovers in addition to the final score and develop a single measure to indicate which team played the better game regardless of the outcome. Sometimes the better team doesn't win. But that's not the way to wager. We want to be able to use this measure as a means of finding attractive underdogs who might not have a good win-loss record but have played much more competitively than final scores might indicate. Conversely, this measure helps us find overvalued and false favorites.

COMP POWR represents Composite Power Rating and is a combination of the two Ratings just described plus the team's Average Power Rating and their Opponents' Average Power Rating. It is the one number that attempts to take into account all of the important factors in analyzing a game and does so without bias. It's based on a formula that we've used for years. And as the season progresses it represents a

pretty good measure of the actual difference between teams.

Finally, '**X FACTOR**' is a measure of correlation between a team's ability to gain or allow yards and their ability to score or prevent points. A positive number is indicative of an efficient team while a negative number indicates an inefficient team. More on this interesting, revealing and very useful statistic next week.

COLLEGE SELECTION OF THE WEEK: MISSISSIPPI - 1 over Lsu – Ole Miss has not missed a beat at QB in the post-Dart era even though Simmons, who started the season was injured in the Arkansas win. Backup Chambliss filled in well and the Rebels – facing 4 FBS teams – are averaging 543 yards and 44.8 points per game. LSU also has impressive season-to-date stats – but here is where stats are misleading. In their 4 games LSU has outscored opponents by 145 yards per game (391-246) and 19.8 points per game (29.0-9.2). But when you take out their 56-10 win over SE Louisiana the stats for LSU vs only FBS teams show and total yards edge of just 85 ypg (345-26) and 11.0 ppg (20.0-9.0). Still impressive but also skewed by that blowout win against lower level competition. Given Clemson's struggles (1-3) LSU's season opening 17-10 road win over Clemson's Tigers has lost luster. And given the recent struggles Florida's had LSU's 20-10 over the Gators is less impressive that might otherwise be thought (especially with LSU +4 in turnovers). The home team has won 5 straight in the series with LSU won 29-26 in OT with the winning TD marking the first time LSU had led all game. The streak continues. Mississippi 30-23.

Other Featured College Selections

Florida State - 7 over VIRGINIA (Friday) – Virginia is playing for a fifth straight week while Florida State take to the road for the first time after opening the season with a statement making 31-17 win over Alabama. The Seminoles followed that win up with a pair of blowout wins over a weak FCS foe and a just as weak FBS opponent (Kent State). FSU will be very fresh for this game and that early season win over 'Bama suggests this season's team is more like the 2023 team that went 13-0 but was left out of the CFP, effects of which seemed to carry over to 2024. The Seminoles went an unthinkable 2-10 (one of the wins a late season win over an FCS foe) and coach Norvell is fortunate to be back for a sixth season. Virginia coach Elliott is in his fourth season and his Cavs have shown modest overall improvement each season. But that progress have been mixed as the offense has shown steady improvement its' been offset by a decline in defense. These ACC foes have met just once in the last decade with FSU winning back in 2019. FSU has the stronger pedigree that goes back decades as a national power under former coach Bowden. But the legendary coach retired in 2009 after 34 years in charge. FSU still has gone a very solid 129-64 with a the 2013 National Championship. During the same time frame Virginia's record was just 74-107. FSU still enjoys a significant recruiting edge and has the stronger and deeper roster. FSU should wear down the Cavs in the second half as playing a sixth straight week takes its toll. Florida State 40-20.

Notre Dame - 4 over ARKANSAS – This game could (or should) be hyped as the "Lou Holtz Bowl" as the longtime coach had success in 7 seasons coaching Arkansas (60-21-2 and all winning seasons) and 11 at Notre Dame (100-30-2 with 10 winning seasons). Notre Dame's fortunes have continued over the passing decades whereas Arkansas has enjoyed only modest success. Current coach Pittman was hired amidst much fanfare but his record since arriving in 2020 is a very modest 32-33 including 2-2 thus far this season. Arkansas' losses have been at Ole Miss and at Memphis. Both wins came against an FCS team and a weak regional opponent, Arkansas State. Notre Dame lost at Miami and to Texas A&M to open the season (both are legitimate Playoff possibilities) before getting its first win last week over Purdue. It is yet to be seen if Arkansas, despite playing at home, can handles this significant step up in class. The key matchup is Arkansas' strong running game vs Notre Dame's strong rush defense. Arkansas has a Bye next week before playing at Tennessee. Although this is not a conference game there is no look ahead with Notre Dame in town. The line does seem short and Notre Dame has faced better competition even though the lost those games by 1 and 3 points. Notre Dame gets the win 37-27.

Alabama + 3 over GEORGIA – Both perennial powers should be well rested and well prepared for this matchup as both are off Byes. Tennessee is off a wild 44-41 OT win at Tennessee in a game they trailed for much of the game. Alabama is off a lopsided 38-14 win over a down Wisconsin program off its first losing season since 2001. Although there a several other worthy contenders this could be a preview of the SEC Title game. Alabama has had the upper hand in this series over the past decade, going 7-1 SU vs the Bulldogs with the lone loss in the 2021 National Championship game which avenged a 26-23 loss to the Tide in the 2017 Championship game. Alabama is 2-0 in regular season games and 4-0 in SEC Title games. As an underdog Alabama is 4-1 both SU and ATS in the series, 3-0 SU, 1-2 ATS as favorites. Of course most of Alabama's success came under former coach Saban facing former assistant and current Georgia coach Smart. As disappointing as 2024's 9-4 season was with DeBoer replacing Saban perhaps the highlight of the season was 'Bama's early season 41-34 win as 1 ½ point home dogs over Georgia.

The point is that when 2 powerhouses meet – teams that often are top 5 in sending players to the NFL every season – taking points is a prudent way to go when there is long term familiarity between the teams and they recruit from the same rich regions and national top talent pool. Alabama wins 27-24.

NFL SELECTION OF THE WEEK: L A RAMS - 3 ½ over Indianapolis – The Rams could easily be 3-0 but for that blocked FG return that ended last week’s game in Philadelphia. Indy could easily be 2-1 but for their benefit of a Denver penalty that gave the Colts a second try of a missed FG. The retry was made and turned what appeared to be a loss into a Week 2 win. Nevertheless the Colts are a much improved team in coach Steichen’s third season. Taking over a team that was 4-12-1 in 2022 the Colts have gone 9-8 and 8-9. The signing of ex-Giants QB Jones has had a huge positive impact thus far. The Colts are

#1 in total offense and #5 in total defense. The Rams are #6 and #8 respectively. The Rams have faced a tougher early schedule. Both played and won road game at Tennessee. The Rams had a decided edge in total yards differential of +187 to +83, an edge that was validated by their yards per play differential of +0.9 ypp. It's not much to go on but does but both wins in perspective. Both teams have the look of Playoffs contenders based on the first 3 weeks. The Rams are looking for their ninth Playoffs trip in the past 7 seasons, 2 of which resulted making it to the Super Bowl (1-1). Coach McVay has become one of the NFL's top coaches in his now 8+ seasons. The Colts last made the Playoffs in 2020. Indy clearly is a team on the rise but the Rams' edge in experience, and proven coaching, rate the nod here, especially after the freakish way they lost in Philly last week after ending last season on the same field in losing in the NFC Championship game. There will be spots spots to back the Colts. Just not here. Rams 27-16.

Other Featured NFL Selections:

Philadelphia - 3 ½ over TAMPA BAY – Both teams survived major scares last week to remain among the six unbeaten teams. The Eagles, down 26-7 early third quarter closed to 26-21 before taking a late 27-26 lead. The blocked the potential game winning Rams' FG attempt and returned it for a TD that not just won the game but also covered the spread. Tampa similarly needed a late FG after giving up what seemed a comfortable 23-6 fourth quarter lead to win 29-27. Tampa's 3 wins are by 3, 1 and 2 points against teams that are a combined 1-8. Trailing most of their game the Eagles finally opened up their passing game which succeeded and should now be more integrated into their game plans that had been mostly geared to short passes and the running game which has yet to be as effective as in 2024. In fact RB Barkley is averaging just 3.3 ypr with his longest run just 16 yards. Tampa is dealing with multiple injuries to their offense, including the line and the injury that will sideline WR Evans. Philly has also won by small margins. The Buccs have won their last 2 meetings vs the Eagles and were they healthier would be in a good spot to make it 3 straight. But the Eagles are still the better balanced and healthier team with a defense that is rounding into shape after off season roster turnover. And Philly has played a much tougher early schedule, defeating 2 teams that they also defeated in last season's runs to their Super Bowl title (Rams and Chiefs). Though outgained in all 3 wins, Iggles still rate the edge. Philadelphia 31-23.

KANSAS CITY + 3 over Baltimore – Both teams are 1-2. Baltimore defeated Cleveland but lost to both Buffalo and Detroit. Kansas City defeated the Giants but lost to the Chargers and Philadelphia. The Chiefs are home underdogs for a second straight home game. The offense showed some signs of improvement when stepping down in class vs the Giants. The defense remains a strength. The reverse is true for the Ravens whose offense is top tier that is supported by a defense that ranks last in yards allowed, #31 in points allowed and #25 in yards per play. In ranking the 4 units #1 is the Baltimore offense, #2 is the Chiefs' defense, #3 is the Chiefs' offense and last is the Ravens' defense. In matchups of a great offense and a great defense the preference is to back the defense. When two below average units meet it's the offense that rates the edge. The winner of this game improves to 2-2 and has a reasonable possibility of contending for the top AFC seed, especially KC which has yet to face Buffalo, the current AFC favorite that's already defeated Baltimore. Raven RB Henry has lost key fumbles twice already, perhaps showing signs of age. The Ravens have been outgained in all 3 games. With WR Worthy still nursing an injury, Thornton may be emerging as a reliable target for QB Mahomes. One of these teams will leave 1-2 and the thought here is that it will be Baltimore. KC's defense keys the win. Kansas City, 27-20.

DENVER - 7 ½ over Cincinnati (Monday) – Cincy is not as bad as they looked in last week's 48-10 thrashing in Minnesota but the impact going for of the loss to injury of QB Burrow is cause for major concern. Backup Browning was harassed all game with 4 sacks and 2 interceptions. And it does not get any easier against a talented and deep Denver defense. That unit is making up for a slow start by the offense and second year QB Nix. This is a key spot for the Broncos who return home after 2 roadies with 2 more up next. Even with Burrow the Bengals' offense had struggled in tight wins at Cleveland and over Jacksonville. Cincinnati has been outgained by 180 yards in 2 of their 3 games but it was due not to a porous defense (has put up average stats) but by a non-productive offense that has twice been held under 175 total yards (and yet to gain more than 53 on the ground). Cincy's QB issues and their lack of their expected strong offense will put more pressure on what has shown to be, early on, a somewhat better defense than we saw last season. Denver gets the solid win, 28-16.
